## SWIMATHON 2024



Last Friday our **Marvellous Marlfields Marlins** set off from school after lunch to walk to the Leisure Centre to take part in the Congleton Rotary Club Annual Swimathon to raise funds for charity. Their chosen charities for this year are:

**The Old Sawmill** – which enhances the lives of local people who are socially isolated, lonely and in need of additional support, and also provides a meeting place for local groups with challenging problems.

**Listen Out Loud** – a Congleton charity which was set up in 2012 to assist ex-service men and women, and supports veterans affected by homelessness and/or mental health problems.

The children got sponsorship for their swimming, we also did some fund-raising within school by holding a Lucky Dip, Cake Sale and a Raffle. Half of the monies raised goes to the Rotary Club and half to a charity of our own choice. This year we have chosen the **RNLI**. The RNLI is run by volunteers, and 93% of their funding is solely from donations. The RNLI saves lives, and need as much support as they can get, which is why we have chosen them this year.

So far, the children, with your help and support have raised almost **£1,000** – come on, let's see if we can do better than that!

## ELECTRONIC GATES

Thank you to everyone who has embraced the new gates on the school driveway. However there are still a few who try to abuse the system.

The gates are **NOT** to be used to get onto the playground or to drop a child off if they are running late – the walking gate further up Waggs Road is open until 9:25am each day. Simply walk your child round that way.

The only people authorised to come through the gates are staff, expected visitors, and parents of children with an EHCP or school transport taxis for children with an EHCP. All other cars/taxis

will be refused entry. Please do not jump through the gates if they are open for a legitimate, authorised driver to enter or leave, as has already happened. Please do not embarrass us or yourself by asking as refusal can often offend. As our notices state "verbal abuse to staff will not be tolerated and may be acted upon".

We are doing our utmost to keep **your** children safe, but if people don't stick to the rules, then we may not be able to do so. Please use the walking gate at drop off or pick up time.

**These need to be in the office by the end of the day Monday, 25<sup>th</sup> March to secure your place.**

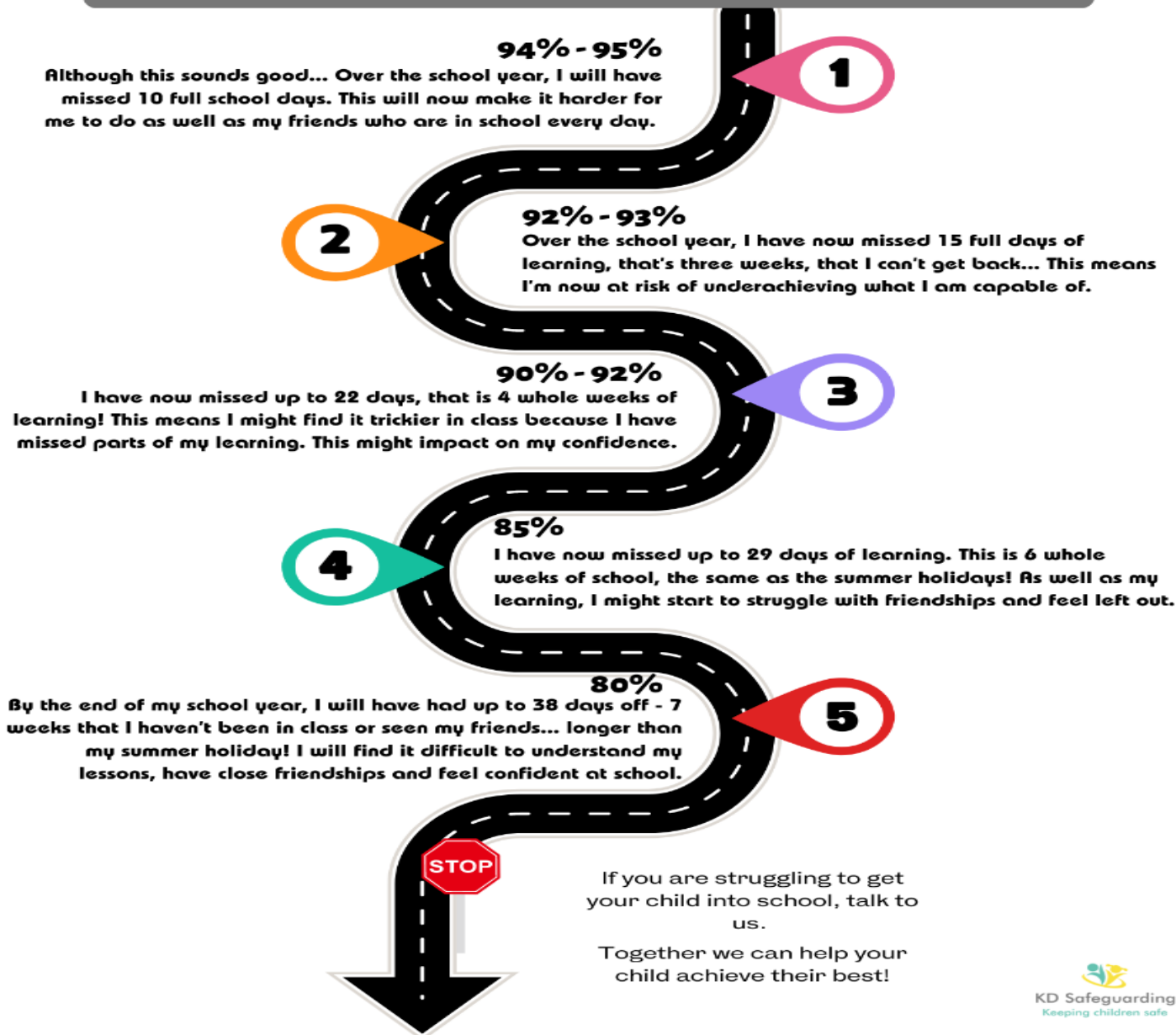
### **ATTENDANCE**
