SWIMATHON

Here at Marlfields, we see making the children aware of the dangers of water a high priority. So, earlier on in the year, the Marvellous Marlfields' Marlins represented us in the Rotary Club Congleton, Annual Swimathon.

All 27 of the children who took part gained sponsorship from family and friends to raise funds for the Rotary Club's chosen charity and for our own charity, which this year was the RNLI. The children managed to raise £736 for the RNLI to go towards the cost of clothing an RNLI crew member (the full cost of clothing a crew member is £1600). Marlfields has been associated with the RNLI for around eight years. We passionately believe that all children should be able to swim more than the recommended 25m which is suggested in the National Curriculum so much that we encourage our children to take part in the Rooky Lifeguard courses on offer which a great many take part in, and successfully complete!

WEATHER

WATER SAFETY

"Drowning Prevention Week" which is this week is the biggest campaign of The Royal Life-Saving Society and this year took place 15th – 22nd June and is aimed at educating children from the age of 5 about water safety. No child should drown, and with the right water safety education such as the Water Safety Code – accidental drownings are preventable. Children need to have a healthy relationship with water and need to know how easily things can go wrong and they need to understand the water code –

- The water may look calm on the surface, but there can be strong undercurrents that could pull even a strong swimmer under the water.
- Even when the weather feels very hot, the water may feel warm on the surface, but just a few feet below the surface it can be icy cold affecting the stamina and strength of even strong swimmers.
- If you are with someone who gets into difficulty, call emergency services for help. If you can, use an object to try and reach for them, but don't put yourself in danger by entering the water.
