ATTENDANCE

Earlier this week, Mrs Isherwood, and Mrs Yoxall as Attendance Supervisors, had a meeting with the Education Welfare Officer for our school regarding the attendance of numerous children. Official letters are being sent out to those who concern us most.

However, we would just like to emphasise to **all** of you the importance of letting school know as early as possible on the first day of absence. If we are not informed the absence will go down on the official register as an unauthorised absence.

The register is a legal document, and as such, marks cannot be altered so please don't ask us to change your child's attendance. For some children there can be a pattern of absence, eg child always ill Thursday and Friday or something like that. If this is noticed, you may be challenged as to the reason of absence and you may be asked to get a note from your G.P. to validate the reason of absence.

To further tighten up attendance we are now implementing a 'Late Book'. If your child arrives when the doors have closed and your child has to come in through the Office they will have to sign in and give a reason for being late. Similarly if you have to pick your child up early, before 3:20pm the book will also need to be filled in with the time of collection and reason for leaving early. There is also a section for if your child is collected late at the end of the day (i.e. after 3:30pm).

END OF DAY

If you need to speak to your child's teacher at the end of the day, please wait until all of the children have safely been sent to their parents before you approach them for a discussion. Alternatively, please call the Office on 01260 633 120 to make an appointment to see the teacher.


CRISIS AVERTED
