Our supportive staff will be giving you a call to follow up this but please be first and put your names down on the list. Days can be booked to suit your planned holidays as you do not need to attend all sessions, just ones that meet your need. Any questions give us a call in the office.

PRE-LOVED UNIFORM

It is that time of year – again give us a call as we have available grants for families to support this and pre-loved uniform on our shelves. Get them this side of the holidays so that you are ready to go in September when we return.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We want to make sure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. Healthy school food has obvious health benefits and can help pupils establish healthy habits for life.

Healthy school food can also help to improve pupils' readiness to learn.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals.

Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190 Registering for free meals could also raise an extra £1,320 for school to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities for your child.

This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above. You can apply even if your child receives Universal Infant Free Meals.

To check if your child is eligible, you can call the Free School Meals Helpline on **0300 123 5012** and they will be able to assist you.

RAGS2RICHES FOR SCHOOLS

Don't forget to clear out your wardrobes, drawers and cupboards and fill in the bags that we sent home a few weeks ago with your unwanted clothing items.
