



# Our Curriculum

# Supporting and Stretching Individuals

The New National Curriculum (2014) is our starting point for planning a tailored curriculum that meets the specific needs of individuals and groups of children. We do this by;

- setting suitable learning challenges and pupil targets from rigorous assessments;
- tracking achievement and progress;
- responding to children's learning and emotional needs;
- identifying & overcoming potential barriers to learning;
- providing curricular opportunities outside school hours;
- working closely with other agencies to tailor support programmes to individual needs;
- supporting children and families outside of school.



# Together Everyone Achieves More



We value all children and as such we actively seek their opinions and ideas. We do this by:

- having real, meaningful conversations with pupils;
- encouraging learning talks and discussions;
- asking pupils to reflect on learning and the learning opportunities presented;
- having an active School Council that drives the pupil voice;
- use the school radio to canvas opinions;
- train children to use support tools like KiVA (our anti-bullying programme).
