## EASTER BREAK

Wishing you all an amazing Easter Break, don't eat too much chocolate and spoil the holiday. We are all ready for a break, and fingers crossed the weather will be favourable for us

**School will reopen on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> April.**

**FURTHER REMINDER:** on our return use of the school driveway via the electronic gates will remain the same. These are in place to keep everyone, especially your children, safe.

The gates are **NOT** to be used to get onto the playground or to drop a child off if they are running late. **The walking gate further up Waggs Road is open until 9:25am each day. Simply walk your child round that way.** Late children need to be signed in at the Office by an adult. The only people authorised to come through the gates are staff, expected visitors, and parents of children with an EHCP or school transport taxis for children with an EHCP. **All other cars/taxis will be refused entry. Please do not jump through the gates if they are open for a legitimate, authorised driver to enter or leave,** as has already happened.

**Please do not embarrass us or yourself by asking to be let through, as refusal can often offend.**

As our notices state **"verbal abuse to staff will not be tolerated and may be acted upon"**. We are doing our utmost to keep **your** children safe, but if people don't stick to the rules, then we may not be able to do so. **Please use the walking gate at drop off or pick up.**

## WORLD RELIGIONS; The Last Supper and the story of Easter.

This week in our world religion lesson Year 1 looked at 'The Last Supper' and how Christians celebrate the holy communion by eating bread to represent the body of Jesus and wine (juice) to represent Jesus' blood. We also looked at Good Friday and the Easter story in class. This was then followed up with an assembly to help the children understand that Jesus forgave everybody for his sins and died with them in order to give everyone a 'clean slate' – this was demonstrated in the assembly by the speaker getting a pie in the face for others mistakes. We then looked at the rebirth of Jesus and how he resurrected on Easter Sunday and what the Easter egg represents (new life). Below are some pictures from this week's lessons and assembly.

 Congleton Park and Hankinson's Field.

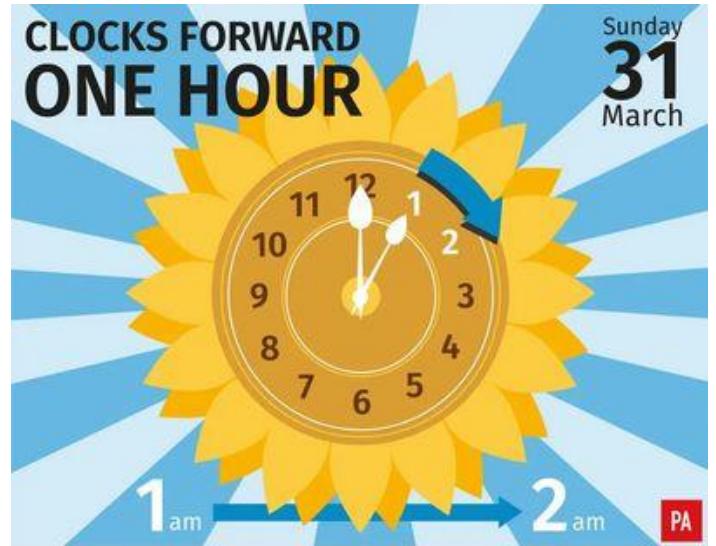
If you find one, CONGRATULATIONS, you have won a
